No one answers properly . The same doctor behaves so well in Private consultation , but in govt PHC or hospital they are not responsive . They just complete the formality .

What do you do if you need more/additional services?</li> </ul>	Kabhi Eko ghanta , dowo ghanta bhi lag jata hai Kuch nahi , har baat ke liye bahar bhej dete hain, It takes lot of time. And who ever gets registration done by can meet the doctor . Medicine is not available and patients are referred to private labs or X-ray units . Beneficiaries have to go private or Sadar Hospital , which too is not much satisfactory .
